How long do they expect us to wait to be treated like everyone else? How long will the church deny our offering of our gifts in ministry? What is behind this delay? Can they still not be trusted? Who is behind this delay? Why do I expend my time, energy and resources when it may all be for naught? Do they not understand the pain? I am through! I don't want to be second class any longer. I want to worship in peace!

These are the feelings that went through the minds of the Board members. I can imagine similar feelings and more went through yours too. What can I say that will allay your fears and still provide hope that we will make it to the finish line? I don't know. You have already been asked to bear the burden for a little longer. Where does the time line end?

So, how do we sort this out? Do I like the delay...NO. But I have been blessed with an overabundance of positivity, bordering on Pollyannaism. In conversations with several people and dealing with processes and event planning, this is what I believe to be reason-

able about the decision to move the U.S. Conference to 2013.

**Financial:** Like everyone else the church has been hit very hard by the near depression since 2007. The staff cuts that were implemented a couple years ago have left a skeleton of what used to be. This translates into people doing much more with less. Those of you who attended the last World Conference saw where staff shortages took its toll. There just isn't enough money and staff to put on 2 major events within 9 months and have them successful...and still get the everyday work done. There certainly are economies of scale to be realized by having the Conferences back to back.

Could they have found a sugar daddy to underwrite the conference? Maybe so. Is that the best use of additional resources? Maybe. Others say that the contributions have dramatically increased (+6%) so far this year. The Church has been blessed with increased revenue because of the dedication of its members. However, the revenue has fallen so dramatically during the recession, that this

These stories have been submitted by gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, and allies, which should give the book a rich perspective from the spectrum of our community. The book will be used as a witnessing tool leading up to the 2013 U.S. Conference, and should be available by January 2012.



From here the process will continue with June through August dedicated to a first read edit by Bill Russell, and copy editing during the last two months. It will then go to the printer for publication. John Whitmer Books again will be the publisher. increase will go towards preventing additional cuts in staff...cuts that will render some functions inoperable, and prevent the church from responding to opportunities as they arise. Even with this increase its sustainability is in question and not lengthy enough to increase spending.

There also is the consideration of the cost to individuals. Some of us can afford the vacation time and expense of going to Independence twice in a year...some cannot. I understand there was pushback from a growing number of people about affordability and questions were being asked about which conference is more important. Some were choosing simply on the basis of tradition and affection for World Conference. Would this have hurt attendance...probably so. Would this have undercut the representation at the National Conference and perhaps prohibited key people and constituent groups from attending...probably so.

**Paradigm Shift:** It is important for us to realize how big of a paradigm shift this could be for our Community and well as the faith community in general. If the issues on the agenda are approved, our Community will be in the forefront of those organizations that support peace and justice in this country...WOW. Section 150 finally applies to us!

Because of this shift and its importance the process needs to ensure that all possible measures be taken to include as much of the Body as possible, especially those that are in the middle (80%) of the spectrum. These are the people the Spirit needs to minister to and the process needs to address. This is why it is so important for you to stay engaged in your

congregation, engage in the Mission Center and go to reunion. Put a face on it, be present be available.

**Community Building:** The U.S. Apostles represent ALL the members of the church in the U.S. They are working to create safe and open space for everyone to learn, discern, ask questions, and share perspectives. This is the nature of learning how to become a conferring and prophetic people. Already there are some who are withholding their world church offerings...some who threaten to leave the church...some congregations who are disassociating. This is the reality of change. Community building is hard work! This is the reality of a U.S. Church that is willing to engage in difficult conversations and pursue God's will for the church regardless of the consequences. Think of the power of that statement. Think of the possibilities.

I continue to support the process that has been outlined. I trust the U.S. Apostles in their journey. I feel the reasons for delay are valid. Certainly there will be stumbles. That always happens when navigating through a strategic process. Cut them some slack! Trust in what has been given. New resources will be coming...the first one – scripture perspectives - is in the hands of the Mission Center Presidents now. Plans are being developed on how to use it in each mission center. Engage. Pray. Be present.

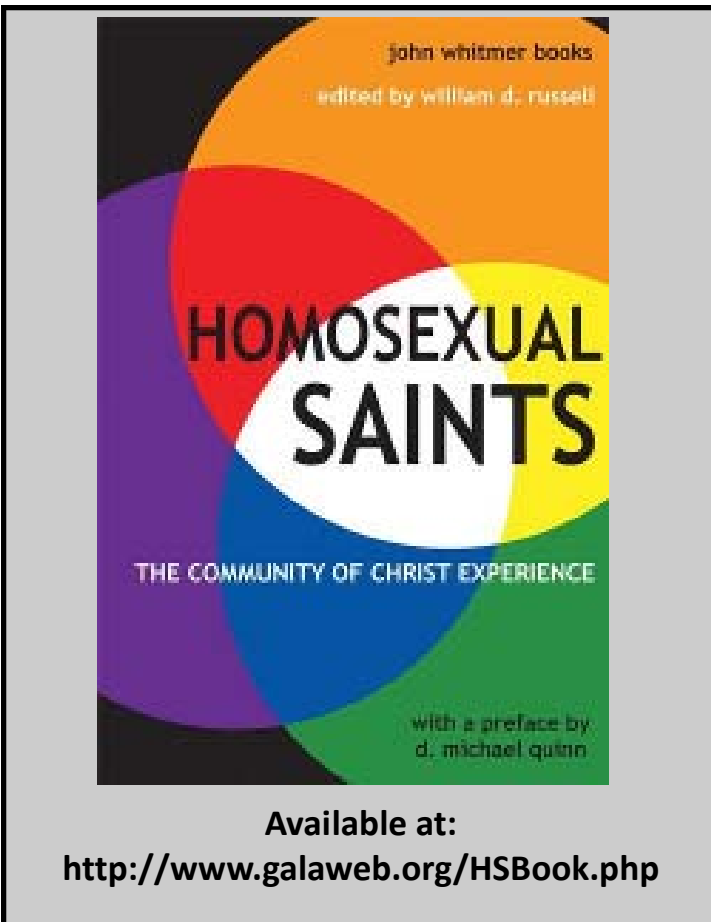

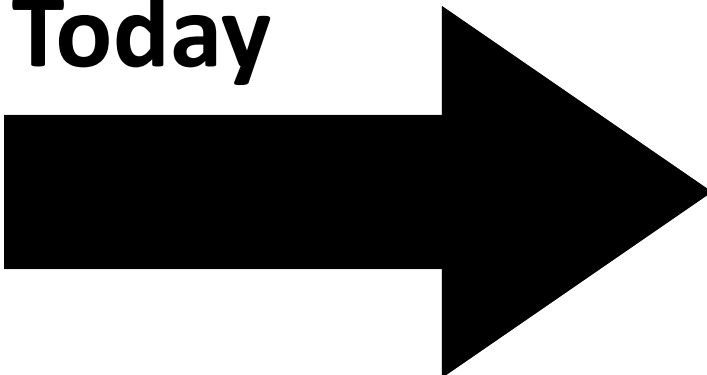
